## **CHAPTER-I**

### **Area and Population**

Situated between 32 to 36 degree North latitude and 75 to 80 degree east longitude and at an altitude ranging from 2900 M to 5900 M, Leh district is scattered on an area of 82665 Sq.Kms (includes 37555 Sq.Km under illegal occupation of China) makes it the largest district in the country is having 112 inhabited and one un inhabited villages with a population of 1,17,232 souls as per 2001 census with Buddhist as the biggest ethnic group followed by Muslim.

According to census 2001, a decline in work participation by 0.3 % has been recorded. The main workers accounts for 33.9% where as 16.2 % Marginal and 49.9 % Non- worker.

CHAPTER-V  
IRRIGATION

Being mountainous with arctic desert condition and scanty rainfall of the district, irrigation depends on the eternal glaciers, which give birth to number of rivulets. However, efforts are being made to bring more barren land under cultivation by constructing irrigation canals on Indus, Shayok and other tributaries.

CHAPTER-VII  
SHEEP HUSBANDRY

The rearing of livestock is a very critical and core activity in the economy profile of the District. Although it is adopted as a subsidiary occupation by a majority of the rural population yet it constitutes a vital activity for economy welfare of the farmers. However the nomadic gaudier population of Changthang depends exclusively on sheep and goat rearing for its livelihood most of the livestock population particularly sheep & goat.

Sheep and goat rearing is mostly concentrated in two blocks of the district and the department of Sheep Husbandry is working for the development of these livestock with the objectives to improve production of Pashmina, wool, meat etc. by genetic up gradation of animals, to find out ideal management technique suited to increase production / reproduction traits, to reduce mortality and to improve pasture and increase fodder production.

Information on livestock population, breeding/health program's etc. is contained in this chapter.

## CHAPTER-XI

### Cooperative

Cooperative movement occupies an important place in the economic life of the people and its activities are diversified in many spheres. At present 68% of families in the rural areas are under cooperative shield. There are 94 cooperative societies in the district out of which 70 are primary agriculture credit societies. The cooperative public distribution items control 75% of consumer business of essential commodities, 100% of fertilizer distribution and 75% of marketing on agriculture produce in the district.

Cooperatives played an important role in the procurement of surplus agriculture produce with the farmers and thereby sales them in the available market. Similarly the consumer cooperatives have played a useful role in holding the price line and in providing the basic necessities to the people at a reasonable price.

CHAPTER-XII  
ELECTRICITY

The generation and distribution of power continues to be one of the most problematic areas of development in the district. The major source of power in the district is Stakna Hydel Project. Due to various reasons, it only generates power for approximately 7 months every year. Generation is affected in summer by the heavy salutation in the river and by freezing in winter when Stakna Hydel Project is not in operation diesel generator sets installed for providing electricity are pressed into service. Even though generation of power by DG sets is expensive one, the Efforts have been made by the department to provide electricity to 112 villages. Data on power generation, consumption, and installation, villages electrified etc. in the district is given in this chapter

CHAPTER-XXVI  
ROAD TRANSPORT

The number of registered motor vehicles has shown a persistent increase over the year. The number of vehicles shown and an increase of 1168 vehicles during 2010-11 over previous year level. As on 31/03/2011 the number of registered vehicle was recorded as 7221 showing a growth of 19.07 % over the year 2009-10.
